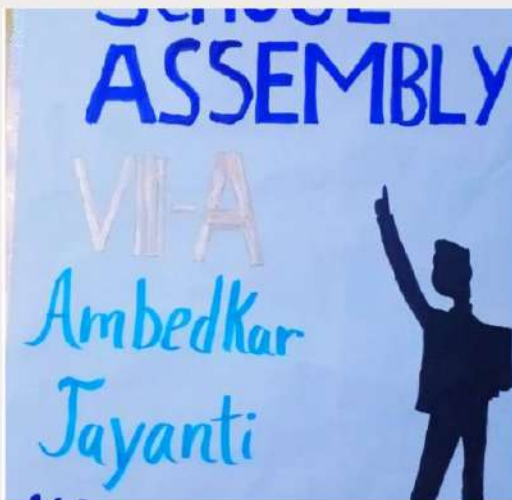
MIDDLE WING

EMBRACING CHANGE: MOVING FORWARD TO A NEW SESSION



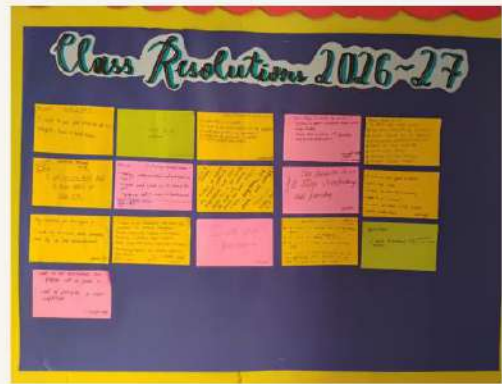
